## **OBSERVATION HOME FOR BOYS**

Since November 30th 2010 the JCL Home (Now Observation Home) was established in Uttar Dinajpur District Inaugurated by Additional District Magistrate (Dev) Mr. P.K Dutta. In this Home Collaboration with the Department of Women and Child and Social Welfare Government of West Bengal. All residents who come in to conflict with the Law are here. According to Government rules, 50 residents are accommodated at present only residents involved in the conflict with the law of Uttar and Dakshin Dinajpur districts live here. Now the project is currently named Mission Vatsalya.

Activities: The daily activities that residents do at home plantation and gardening, daily study at Library, Art and Craft, Kitchen Garden, Personal Hygiene, Yoga and Computer class.

**Vocational Training:** Mobile repairing course is being taught to the residents of our home.

**Major achievements:** 68 residents returned home in the last one year.

## **CHILD IN NEED CARE & PROTECTION GIRL (CNCP) HOME**

**Introduction:** Children are among the most vulnerable sections of society, and girls, in particular, often face unique challenges such as neglect, abuse, exploitation, and abandonment. The Child Need Care and Protection Home for Girls is a dedicated residential institution established on 25<sup>th</sup> August 2014 at Debinagar, at present CNCP Girls Home has shifted at our main campus from January'2025 with sanction cappacity of 25. It aims to provide a safe, nurturing, and rehabilitative environment for girls in need of care and protection.

This CNCP Home serves as a secure shelter for girls who have been orphaned, abandoned, victims of abuse, or rescued from exploitative situations. The primary objective is to ensure their holistic development—covering physical health, emotional well-being, education, skill development, and social reintegration. The home operates with a child-centric approach, maintaining the dignity and rights of every resident, while striving to reintegrate them into society or a stable family environment, whenever possible.

By offering psychosocial support, legal aid, education, and life skill training, the home acts as a bridge between trauma and transformation—empowering girls to reclaim their future with dignity and confidence.

### **Activity:-**

- ✚ Basic Care and Shelter with Education and Learning
- ✚ Formal schooling through government schools and Non-formal education also.
- ✚ Health and Medical Services
- ✚ Vocational Training , Recreational and Cultural Activities
- ✚ Daily physical exercises, yoga, and indoor/outdoor games
- ✚ Celebrations of festivals, birthdays, and national events, Cultural programs, dance, music, art and craft
- ✚ Legal aid and coordination with Child Welfare Committees (CWC)
- ✚ Family Tracing and Restoration
- ✚ Pre-restoration counselling for child and family
- ✚ Post-restoration follow-ups for reintegration support
